The house on the corner of Garfield and Wilson was brought up as a concern. Trash in the yard, loud noises into the night, numerous cars/trucks parked in the driveway and yard. Residents are concerned for the young children living in the house. Brandon shared that the landlord has been advised and an eviction notice has been started. The City is responsible for code violations so please contact if you feel there are areas of concern with a property the Health Department deals with issues such as garbage and exterior home issues. There are departments and ways to contact these departments on the Third Ward website. Concern regarding children living in this home was expressed by neighbors.

#### Demmler Park - Susan Miller

# Zoning - Aaron Brewster, City Council TW Rep

We lost our amendment brought forward by Aaron Brewster to have the Third Ward zoned GR which would prevent multi - family homes at the Quad Plex level. The City Council voted to have the Third Ward zoned NR which allows for bigger muti-family structures in parecels large enough. The amendments that Aaron proposed were voted down. Aaron is encouraging neighbors to be diligent. If you see something report it! We need to keep on top of any proposed changes in our neighborhood.

  offered to serve as an additional university contact, relieving Jake Grasse of some responsibilities. She
  provided updates on the upcoming UWEC Homecoming on October 4th, which will include a parade,
  football game, tailgating, and a post-game party. Additionally, she shared information about the Science and
  Health Building's topping-off ceremony and ongoing construction, noting that the first classes in the building
  are expected in fall 2027.
